

# HEREWITH A REPORT OF THE ACTIVITIES OF THE NEWCASTLE DISTRICT BOWLING ASSOCIATION (ZONE 2) INC. FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30th JUNE, 2017

#### **CLUB MEMBERSHIP:**

There are 46 affiliated clubs within the Association. As at 31st March, 2017 (end of the NDBA financial year) there were 4766 Full and Junior Members as against 4965 in 2016.

#### **EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE:**

2016-2017 saw John Smith re-elected as the President of the Association. Vice-Presidents Terry Blow, Kevin Bucklee, Brian Carling, David Gilday, William Masson & Danny Rowe retained their positions while Keith Rearden replaced Charlie Glass. Don Wells was re-elected unopposed to the position of Treasurer.

Brian Carling was re-elected unopposed as the State Councillor for Zone 2. The Chairmen of the Permanent Sub-Committees were as follows, viz Advisory, Brian Carling; Coaching, Ted Masson; Greens, Dave Carroll; Juniors, Jason Stokes; Match, David Gilday; Membership, Charlie Glass; Selection, Terry Blow and Umpires, Kevin Bucklee.

The members of the Executive have had another extremely busy schedule throughout the year attending functions at Clubs and other Associations. On some occasions they met nine commitments on the one day, whilst on others the President was only able to fulfil all requests by enlisting the services of members from the Sub-Committee.

#### **ADVISORY COMMITTEE:**

The Committee welcomed back long standing member John Lieb & Keith Rearden after a short break. Both these members have contributed valuable information over the years and we look forward to their continued participation in the future. Ray Ashworth resigned due to other commitments. We thanked him for his input during the time he was on the Committee.

This period has been rather quiet as opposed to recent years. Our tasks in conjunction with the Match & Executive Committees has been the review of Advisory Pamphlets No. 6 Hosting of a District Championship/Pennant Post- Sectional Fixture/Representative Game & No 21 Duties of a Returning Officer. Both of these have been converted to a check list type document, rather than the written statements as previous.

The decision to marry the Advisory Committee & Membership Committee is beginning to work. The Membership Committee now having 4 members as opposed to 1 gives us more voices around the table to contribute their thoughts and ideas on this important task ahead for all clubs in the future.

The Duties of the Advisory Committee are listed in the "NDBA Regulations". Should a bowling member within Zone 2 be interested in joining the Sub-Committee for 2017/2018, you would be very welcome.
